Waverley Gymnastics Centre (WGC) was formed in 1987 and has since established an outstanding reputation in all aspects of gymnastics, most particularly in Women's High Performance Gymnastics. WGC is a not-for-profit organisation managed by the Director, Management staff and an elected volunteer Committee and is fully affiliated with both Gymnastics Victoria and Gymnastics Australia. WGC has a strong membership base with more than 1500 gymnasts varying in ages from 2 - 21 years of age, of which 125 gymnasts make up our renowned competitive program comprising of National and International Streams of Gymnastics. The National Stream program comprises of our pre-squad and Levels 1-10 gymnasts. Once gymnasts reach Level 9 they will either move to WGC National Level 10 or into the WGC International Stream program at Future International Level.



Our Philosophy:

We believe that the key to happy, healthy and hungry to learn high-performance gymnasts is the successful partnership of gymnasts, parents, coaches and management. For this partnership to flourish there needs to be mutual trust, open communication, and a shared vision. We believe in an athlete-centred approach to all decision-making to ensure athlete wellbeing is our highest priority. We are 100% committed to providing an inclusive, safe and fun environment where athletes thrive.

Goals:

Waverley's goal is to empower and support every gymnast to reach their individual potential. This may be to represent WGC at the State Championships; to represent Victoria at the Australian National Championships or to represent Australia Internationally.

Waverley is extremely proud to have gymnasts performing at the highest levels of excellence and successfully representing Australia at Olympics, Commonwealth Games and World Championships. We are even more proud to have so many happy and healthy girls learning invaluable life skills whilst fulfilling their passion for their chosen sport.

By incorporating initiatives such as our bi-annual progress and wellbeing reviews, gymnast check ins, squad parent meetings, parent check ins, interactive parent sessions and social catch ups as part of our <u>'Gymnastics Partnership'</u> we aim for all aspects of our gymnasts and squad families' experience at WGC to be supported and well rounded.

Olympic Games:

Waverley is the only WAG Gymnastics Program in Australia that has had gymnasts represent Australia at the last four consecutive Olympic Games.



At the 2020 Tokyo Olympics (held in 2021), Emily Whitehead represented Australia after earning a quota spot to represent Australia by winning the Continental Championships in May 2021. Her coach, John Hart, was also selected as Gymnastics WAG Head Coach for Australia. Emily successfully hit all four apparatus in Tokyo. This was an exceptional achievement, particularly given the many challenges to her preparation due to the global pandemic.





At the **2016 Rio Olympics** WGC's Larrissa Miller was the only Australian WAG gymnast selected to represent Australia along with coach John Hart. Competing at the 2016 Rio Olympics earned Larrissa the title of Dual Olympian; an amazing achievement.





At the **2012 London Olympics** WGC's Georgia Bonora was selected onto the London Olympic Team and was accompanied by coach John Hart where the team finished in $10^{\rm th}$ position. Competing in the 2012 London Olympics has earned Georgia the title of Dual Olympian; an amazing achievement.

At the **2010 Inaugural Youth Olympics** in Singapore, WGC's gymnast Angela Donald was Australia's sole WAG representative and <u>made history</u>, <u>winning Australia's first and only gymnastics Olympic medal</u> with her Bronze medal performance on Beam.





At the **2008 Beijing Olympics**, WGC had two gymnasts selected onto the Australian team as well as the selected travelling reserve. These two gymnasts Georgia Bonora and Shona Morgan went on to become the highest scoring Australian gymnasts at the Olympics placing 13^{th} and 15^{th} in the world, and were the two highest contributors to the team result of 6^{th} place – Australia's best result in Olympic Women's Gymnastics history.



Commonwealth Games:



In 2022, Waverley Gymnastics had two senior gymnasts represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games held in Birmingham in the UK. Emily Whitehead represented Australia at her second Commonwealth Games and Romi Brown was selected for her first Commonwealth Games. Waverley also had Jessica Mason selected as an Australian Team Coach at her first Commonwealth Games. The gymnasts achieved a sensational Silver Team medal with Emily Whitehead also achieving an individual Bronze medal on the Floor.





In 2018 WGC had senior gymnast Emily Whitehead represent Australia at the Commonwealth games on the Gold Coast, Australia where the Australian team earnt a bronze medal in the team event. Emily then went on to win herself an individual bronze medal in the vault final and placed an impressive 5th in the beam final. WGC also had 3 athletes selected as the Australian Team reserves for these games.



In 2014 WGC had senior gymnast Larrissa Miller represented Australia at the Commonwealth games in Glasgow, Scotland where the Australian team earnt a silver medal in the team event. Larrissa then went on to win herself an individual silver medal on the uneven bars.








Australian Level 10 Team Tours:



2022: In 2022 Level 10 gymnast Jessica Eland was selected to represent Australia at the Friendship Classic, an International event for Level 10 athletes. Unfortunately, due to circumstances out of our control, the event did not run, however the selection onto such a prestigious team is one to be celebrated.

2017: WGC Level 10 gymnast Rachel Laval was selected to represent Australia at the 2017 New Zealand National Levels challenge as part of the New Zealand







2015: WGC Level 10 gymnast Taylah Laval represented Australia at the 2015 New Zealand National Levels Challenge. The Level 10 team placed 1^{st} All Around and individually Taylah placed 1^{st} on Vault and 5^{th} on Bars.

Australian Championships Results:



2023: Our WGC Level 8-10 and Future and Senior International gymnasts performed beautifully representing Victoria at the 2023 Australian Championships. This competition also served as the qualification for Australia to compete a team at the 2023 World Championships and our Senior gymnast Breanna Scott was a key part of the team that won the Gold medal and Breanna also individually won Gold on Beam. Further, Emily Whitehead, Miella Brown and Breanna Scott were all named on the 2023 World Championships Squad of 12. Our Waverley Gymnasts claimed 4 Gold medals, 2 Silver medals and 1 Bronze medal. Our gymnasts also claimed 3 individual national titles.

2022: Our Waverley Level 8-10, Junior and Senior International Level gymnasts once again did a fantastic job representing Victoria at the 2022 Australian Gymnastics Championships. The competition also served as the qualification event for the Australian Commonwealth Games Team where Emily Whitehead and Romi Brown secured their places on the team. Our gymnasts claimed 6 Gold medals, 10 Silver medals and 12 Bronze medals. Our gymnasts also claimed 3 individual national titles.

2021: Our WGC ALP level 8-10's and Junior and Senior IL gymnasts did an amazing job representing Victoria at the 2021 Australian Gymnastics Championships. No other state had to endure two lockdowns or had the amount of time off all apparatus as the Victorian Clubs did, so it was an amazing accomplishment to have so many podium finishes. Our gymnasts claimed 4 national titles as well as 5 Silver and 1 Bronze medal. We had two of our Senior IL gymnasts compete wonderful routines at the Continental Championships. One of our gymnasts, Emily Whitehead, won the title and earned the final spot to compete at the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games, which was such an incredible achievement.

Victorian Championships Results:



2023: WGC gymnasts once again had fantastic results at the State Championships in 2023 (with the Metro Sth State Championships and Junior Victorian Championships still to come in Sep/Oct 2023). So far at the April 2023 Senior Victorian Championships, the WGC team achieved Team State titles at Snr International, Junior International and Silver Team medals at Future International and Level 8. Waverley gymnasts took out a total of 9 Gold medals, 8 Silver Medals and 5 Bronze medals.

2022: Waverley was proud to have 9 Victorian All Around Champions, 4 Victoria Team Champions and 11 Victorian Apparatus Champions at the first Victorian Championships held since 2019 due to COVID-19 lockdowns. Within the International levels, our teams were crowned Victorian Champions at 4 out of the 5 levels for which there was a team event! Waverly gymnasts also received 34 Gold medals, 21 Silver medals and 22 Bronze medals.

John also holds a Bachelor of Applied Science in Sports Coaching and Administration and Level 3 WAG International coaching qualifications. John has had gymnasts selected to compete for Australia at the 2022, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2015, 2014, 2010, 2009, 2007 and 2006 World Gymnastics Championships, and he was selected as an Australian Team Coach for each of these events.

John has had gymnasts successfully represent Australia and medal at the 2022, 2018, 2014 and 2010 Commonwealth Games. Most notably, John is the only WAG coach in Australia to have had gymnasts represent Australia at the last four Olympic Games; 2020 Tokyo; 2016 Rio de Janeiro, 2012 London and 2008 Beijing. He was the Australian WAG Coach for both the 2016 Rio de Janeiro and 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.

John has been the recipient of a number of prestigious awards over the years, including: Gymnastics Australia (GA) High Performance Coach of the Year in 2021, 2015 and 2014, and 'Victorian Coach/Coaching Team of the Year' in 2022, 2021, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2014, 2010, 2008, and 2006. John attributes his athletes' success to empowering gymnasts to reach their potential whilst maintaining a positive and supportive environment for them to achieve.

Shaoyi Jiang is a world-renowned International gymnastics coach with more than 30 years of elite coaching experience and a Level 3 International Coaching qualification. Shaoyi Jiang had coached numerous Australian Champions to key benchmark events, including the Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games and World Championships. Before this, she was a world revered Chinese National Coach.

Shaoyi has had gymnasts represent Australia at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2012 London Olympics, 2016 Rio Olympics and 2020 Tokyo Olympics. Shaoyi has formed an integral part in not only Waverley's success but developing our gymnasts for international success at benchmark events. Shaoyi has notably coached Monette Russo, Georgia Bonora, Shona Morgan, Larissa Miller and Emily Whitehead.

Shaoyi's expertise and knowledge of elite gymnastics is nothing short of extraordinary, with her gymnasts winning an impressive total of 6 Gold, 7 Silver and 9 Bronze Commonwealth





Games medals. Shaoyi has also been the recipient of several prestigious awards over her successful coaching career, including the prestigious 'Gymnastics Australia Women's Senior Coaching Team of the Year' Award (2014, 2015, 2021).



Yusuf Topari joined the Waverley team in February 2023 and works as a Senior International coach with our International Squad 1. Yusuf, a former New Zealand national team member is highly experienced in the High-Performance space having worked as the High-Performance Manager at Gymnastics New South Wales since 2013 and is a High-Performance accredited coach in both MAG and WAG, is FIG 3 certified and has qualifications in both Business Management and Personal training. Yusuf has coached a number of national team members including 2022 Commonwealth Games medallist and 2022 World Championships team member Breanna Scott as well as athletes who competed at the 2019 World Championships and a number of World Cups and international events. Yusuf was also fortunate to be named as team coach for both the 2022 Commonwealth Games and 2022 World Championships

campaigns having the unique opportunity to have athletes selected on both the MAG and WAG teams. Yusuf has a coaching ethos centred around empowering athletes to be the best versions of themselves and believes this can be done through hard work and creating a positive and structured environment.

Jessica Haintz joined Waverley in 2012 and works with our elite pathway development athletes (Future - Junior International). Grace Yang is Waverley's Head of Ballet; she works weekly with every gymnast in our competitive stream program from pre-squad to Senior International and conducts their annual ballet examinations. She is a registered and qualified coach with Gymnastics Australia. Grace danced professionally for the Beijing Institute of Dance and has held leading roles in the renowned Herbei Province Opera and Ballet theatre. She has twice won the Province dance gold medal and a bronze in China's National Dance Championships. Grace has been teaching ballet to elite gymnasts at Waverley for over 20 years and is a major contributor to our gymnasts' continuing competitive success. Grace is an extremely passionate and driven instructor, she holds high expectations of her athletes whilst delivering fun, yet highly technical, ballet/dance fundamentals to the gymnasts.



Natalie Bray commenced coaching at Waverley in 2018 and works with our competitive stream gymnasts across dance and ballet. She is a registered and qualified coach with Gymnastics Australia. Natalie trained full-time as a ballet dancer for 5 years at the Jane Moore Academy of Ballet and 1 year at the Australian Ballet School Level 5. She has completed her Royal Academy of Dance ballet teacher training course with a Certificate in Ballet Teaching Studies and also holds a Certificate 2 in Dance. She works with all our athletes from our Foundation Squads through to our Senior International gymnasts and plays a big part in our fabulous choreography and artistic beam and floor routines!





Qinghua Yang is a world-renowned gymnastics coach with a coaching degree from the Beijing Physical culture and Sports College in China and more than 15 years' experience as a senior elite gymnastics coach at the Hunan Training Centre in Changsha P.R. China, and a further 10 Years as Women's Senior Gymnastics Coach at the Australian Institute of Sport.

Mr Yang had gymnasts selected on the 2000 and 2004 Olympic teams and was selected as an Australian Olympic coach for the Sydney 2000 Olympics. Mr Yang's gymnasts were selected and he was also an Australian Team Coach of the 1998 and 2002 Gold medal winning Commonwealth Games Gymnastics Teams. He was also an Australian Team Coach and his gymnast competed successfully on the 2003

World Championships Bronze medal winning Team.

Mr Yang came to Waverley from 2010-2015 working predominately across International Squad 1 and 2 as well as providing expertise and mentorship to other squads and coaches. In 2016 he was offered a senior role close to home at Knox Gymnastics and a year later Gymnastics Australia asked him to take on the Junior and Senior International gymnasts at the Melbourne National Centre of Excellence (NCE), where his gymnasts competed successfully at the 2017 and 2018 World Championships and the 2018 Commonwealth Games.






High Performance Support Program: (HPSP)

At WGC we recognize the importance of holistic support for our gymnasts in our squad program. A core component of the WGC High Performance Support Program (HPSP) is our Sports Science and Medicine services.

Historically in gymnastics, the term 'medical support' has been widely used to cover services such as Physiotherapy and Sports Medicine. To align with modern references and support services used widely across many other Olympic and non-Olympic sports, we have shifted to using terminology at WGC that encompasses all aspects of the 'out of gym' support services that can be accessed to provide the gymnasts with the holistic support they may need to reach their potential. Under the Sports Science and Medicine (SSM) umbrella here at Waverley are the following support services that we engage to provide holistic care to the gymnasts and families:

Physiotherapy

We have an expert and experienced team of physiotherapists from the Bounce Health Group who treat on-site at WGC. The physiotherapists offer the following services:

- musculoskeletal screenings to identify areas of imbalance that may lead to injuries if not addressed
- provide subsequent individualized injury prevention programs to our gymnasts
- acute injury management
- chronic injury management
- manage the 'return to play' process of athletes transitioning from an injury back into training or from extended periods away from apparatus training such as the COVID-19 global pandemic
- specific squads/levels participate in physiotherapist-led Injury Prevention classes during the term, where the gymnasts in the squad are prescribed Pilates-based exercises to support continuing strength and stability specific to gymnasts.

<u>When</u>: Treatment onsite at the Bounce/WGC clinic on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. <u>Cost:</u> As per Bounce Health Group fee schedule (see page 25). Payment on the day is required.



VIS Scholarships

WGC also collaborates with the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS) and has several gymnasts with VIS scholarships. VIS Scholarship holders can access support services such as physiotherapy, sports medicine, myotherapy, dietetics and lifestyle support from VIS providers at no cost. Please note that only athletes who are categorised by the AIS may receive VIS scholarships. For more information regarding VIS scholarships, please contact the High Performance Manager.

Sports Medicine

WGC has an ongoing relationship with Sports Physicians at Bounce Health Group. Appointments can be made through Bounce, and communication around outcomes from any appointments regarding a gymnastics injury or illness will be fed through to both parents and to the necessary coaches and support staff in order to manage the injury/illness.

When: By appointment through Bounce Health Group

Cost: As per Bounce Health Group fee schedule

Myotherapy

WGC has a fully qualified Myotherapist who treats onsite each week across two days.

The Myotherapist delivers the following services:

- individualized treatments according to the specific needs of each of the gymnasts
- treatments for optimizing recovery
- treatments to compliment athletes' injuries
 - When: Thursday and Friday at Waverley Gymnastics Centre
 - Cost: As per Bounce Health Group fee schedule (see page 25). Payment on the day is required.

WGC also collaborates with the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS) and has a number of gymnasts with VIS scholarships. VIS Scholarship holders are also able to access VIS network Sports Myotherapists at no cost. Please contact WGC HP Manager to access these services.

Facilities:

Over the past 8 years, Waverley secured \$7.4 million in funding from Local, State and Federal Government for a new custom built gymnastics facility at Oakleigh Recreation Centre. In mid-January 2021, the Club moved into our new home which is undoubtedly one of the best gymnastics facilities in Australia. The new venue is more than double the size of our previous Mt Waverley gym, and features a permanent viewing area for parents, brand new changerooms, lockers, toilets and reception, new medical rooms, a kitchenette for parents, and much larger office space.

Schools:

WGC is proud to have partnership agreements with three schools in the ORC area; Wesley College Glen Waverley, Ashwood High School and Mt Waverley Heights Primary School. These schools are exceptional in their support of elite athletes and work together with staff at WGC to ensure that the girls are receiving the best possible timetables around their existing gymnastic timetables and ensuring extra support when needed and most importantly providing an excellent standard of education.

Families interested in attending one of these preferred educational providers will need to be actively involved in supporting their daughter in managing a modified education program.

All school fees and associated costs are at the expense of the family. Partnerships with preferred educational providers have been established with government and independent schools to allow for personal preference and individual needs.

Transport:

This service transports students between ORC, Ashwood High School, Wesley College (Glen Waverley Campus) and Mt Waverley Heights Primary School. Transport to other local schools may be negotiated upon request. A fee applies to utilise



this service.

School Scholarships:

Wesley College invites prospective students to apply for General Excellence and/or Academic scholarships.
